#### PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS (For Nine Months as on 31.12.17)

- > Ever best achievements during the nine-months of the FY 2017-18.
  - 1. Import of 3.83 LMT of DAP/MOP/NPK during the nine months as compared to 2.19 LMT during CPLY besides trading of seeds, compost and Agro-chemicals.
  - **2.** Ever best sale of DAP/MOP/NPK of 3.71 LMT during the nine months as compared to 2.07 LMT during CPLY .i.e. increase of 1.64 LMT (79%).
  - **3. Ever best sale of all the fertilizers** of 33.90 LMT during the nine months as compared to 30.94 LMT during CPLY .i.e. increase of 2.96 LMT (10%).
  - **4. Ever best Urea sale of 30.19** LMT during the nine months as compared to 28.87 LMT during CPLY .i.e. increase of 1.32 LMT (5%).
  - 5. Ever best sale of Nitric Acid of 50451 MT.
  - 6. Five year best sale of Ammonium Nitrate of 6985 MT.

- Increase in turnover from ₹5784.64 crore during CPLY to ₹ 6844.33 crore during the nine-months period due to higher sale of urea (by 1.32 LMT), DAP/MOP/NPK (by 1.64 LMT) and rise in gas prices by 18.56%.
- Reduction in Finance cost
  - 1. Despite higher import of traded goods of 3.83 LMT (₹ 870 crore), finance cost has reduced by ₹ 10.17 crore in comparison to CPLY.
  - 2. On like to like basis (excluding impact of interest on purchase of imported traded goods), the interest cost has reduced by ₹ 38.34 crore.



#### PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS (For Nine Months as on 31.12.17) Cont.....

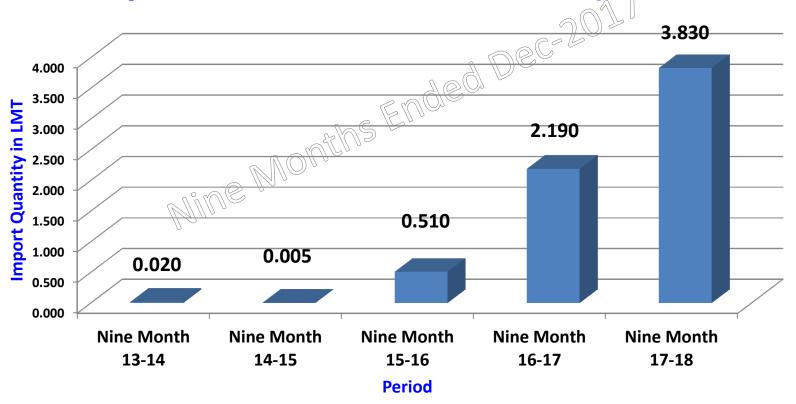
- > EBITDA of ₹ 363.60 crore was lower by 7% in comparison to ₹ 390.32 crore during CPLY. This was mainly on account of adhoc provision for liability for gratuity and pay revision by ₹ 160.14 crore.
- **EBITDA** on like to like basis, without considering the impact of gratuity and pay revision the EBITDA has increased by ₹ 133.34 crore (34%) as compared to CPLY.
- Profit Before Tax (PBT) of ₹ 230.59 crore during the period as compared to ₹ 202.82 crore during CPLY, i.e., increase of ₹ 27.77 crore (14%).
- Profit Before Tax (PBT) on like to like basis of ₹ 353.64 crore during the period without considering the impact of pay revision and gratuity and other income from sale of assets.
- Profit After Tax (PAT) of ₹ 145.09 crore during the period as compared to ₹ 119.15 crore during CPLY, i.e., increase of ₹ 25.94 crore (22%).
- Bentonite Sulphur plant commissioned with installed capacity of 25000 MT in December 2017 at Panipat.

# Purchase of Traded Goods Quantity for the first nine months of Last 5 Years

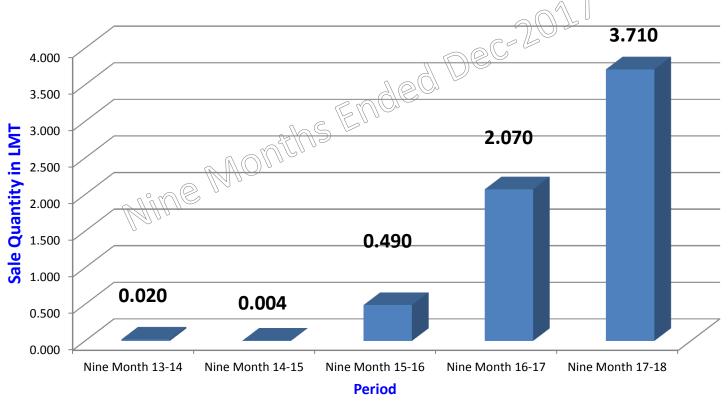

# Sale of Traded Goods Quantity for the first nine months of Last 5 Years

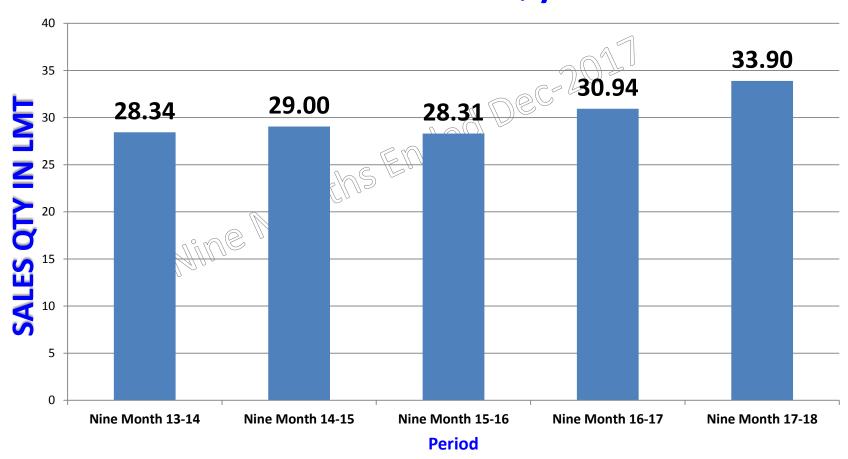

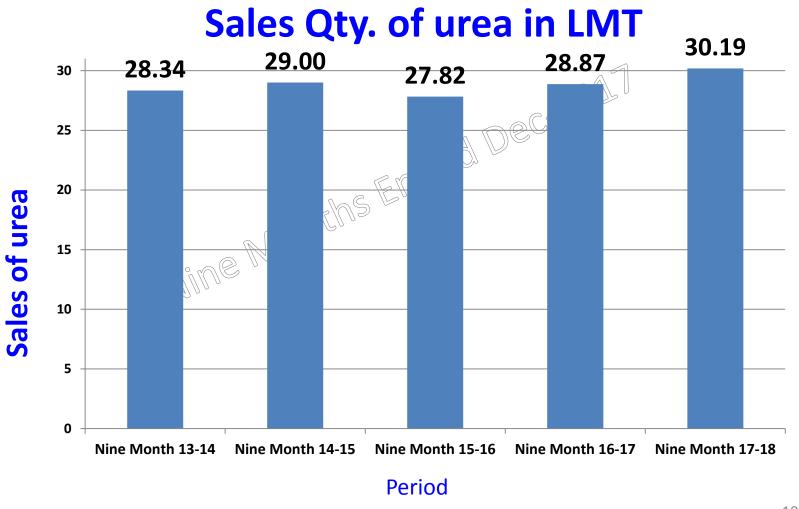
# Total Fertilizers Sales Quantity for the first nine months of Last 5 Years

#### **Total Fertilizers Sales Qty in LMT**





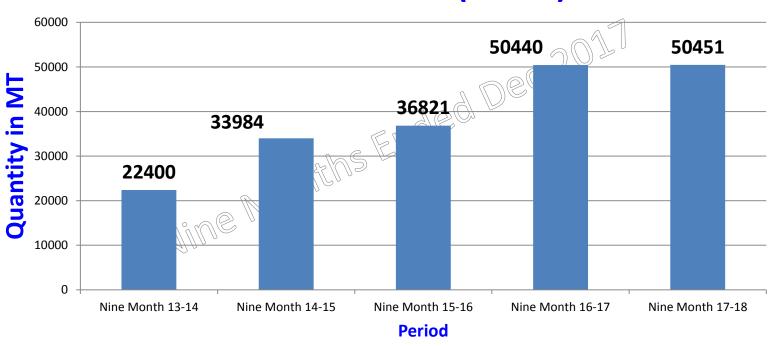
# Sale Quantity Of Urea For the first nine months of Last 5 Years





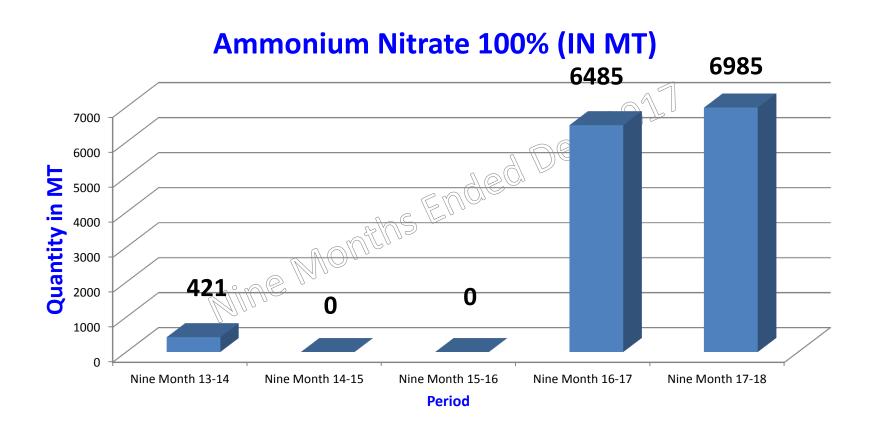
## Sale Quantity of Industrial Products (Nitric Acid) for the first nine months of Last 5 Years

#### Nitric Acid 100% (in MT)





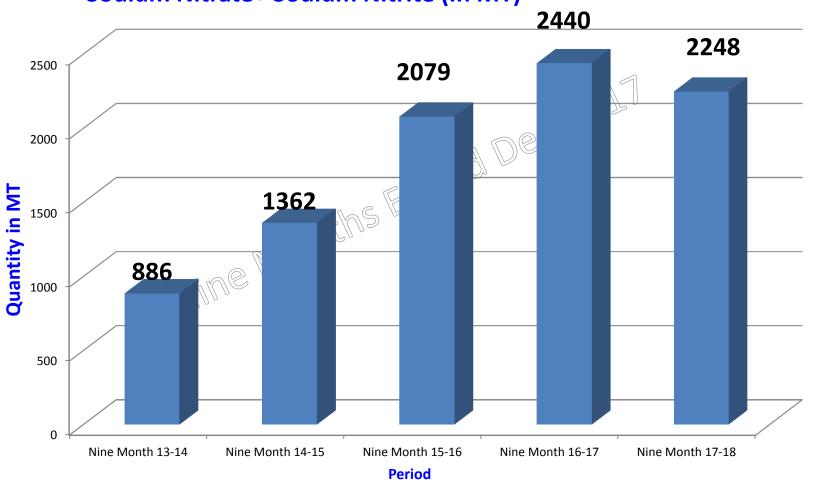
### Sale Quantity of Industrial Products (Ammonium Nitrate) for the first nine months of Last 5 Years

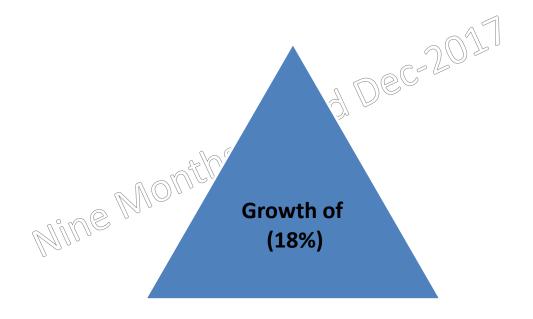






### Turnover Growth For Nine Months 17-18 and Nine Months 16-17

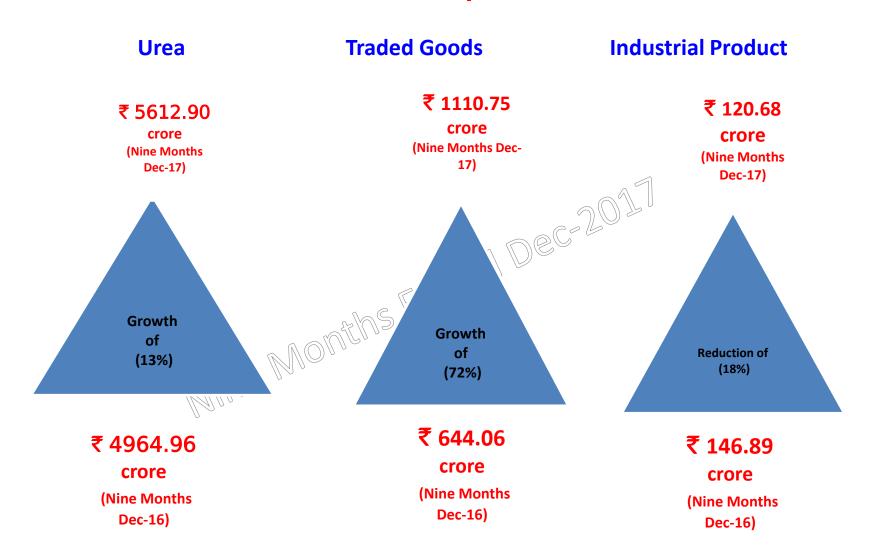

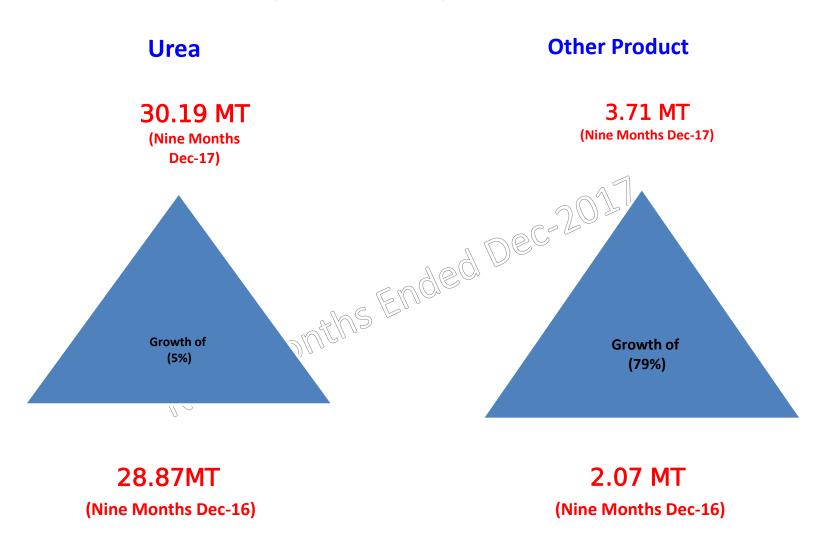


#### **Turnover Growth Break-up For Nine Months 17-18**



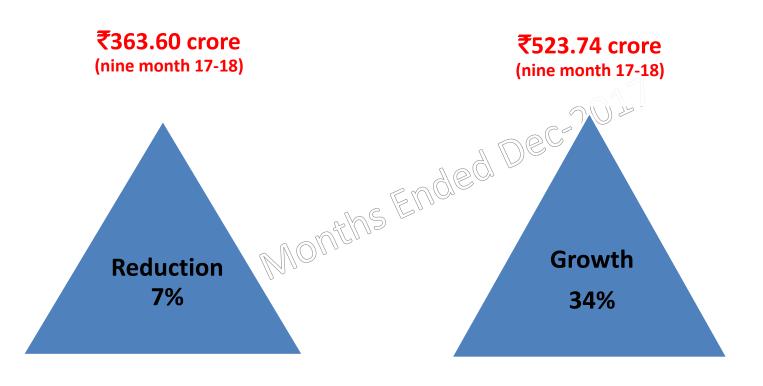


#### Sale Break-up in Quantity For Nine Months 17-18

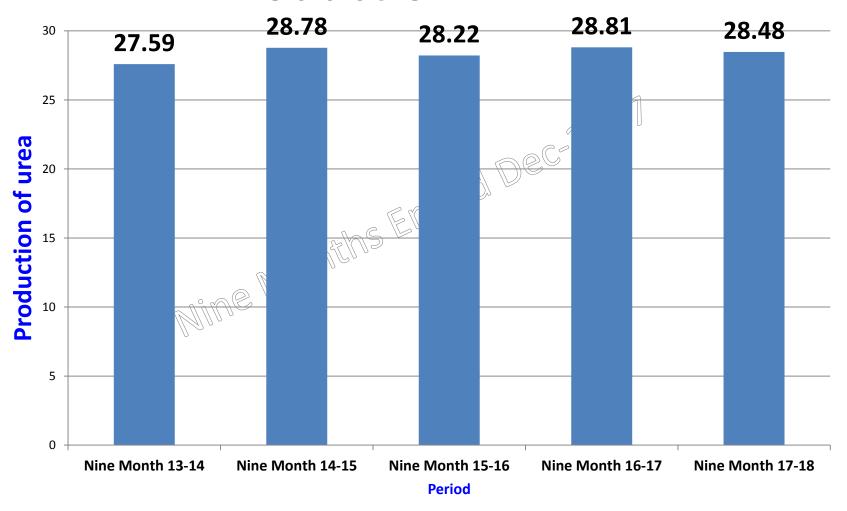

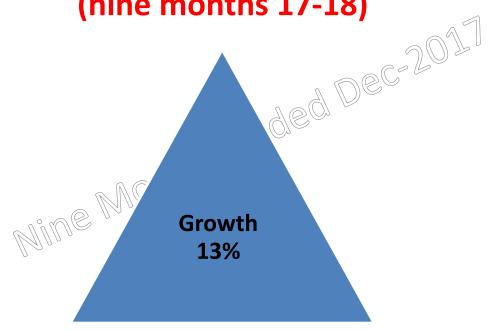

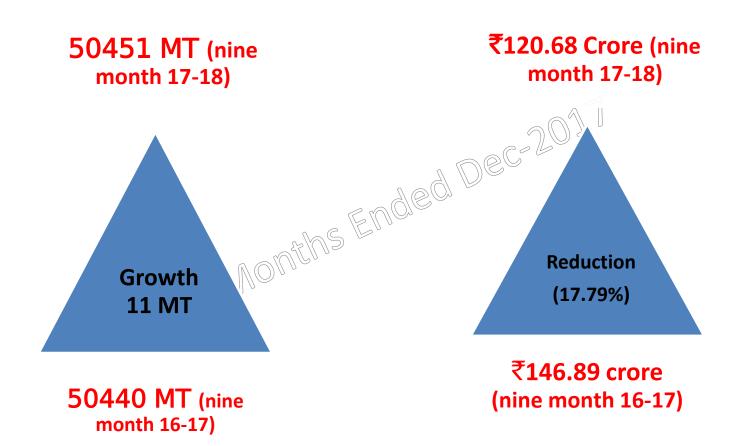

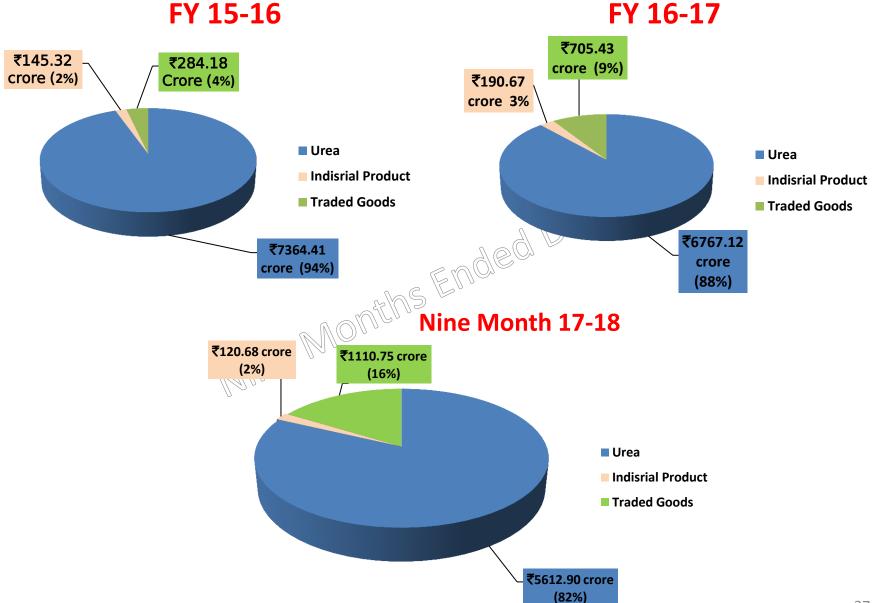

### Sale Value Break-up

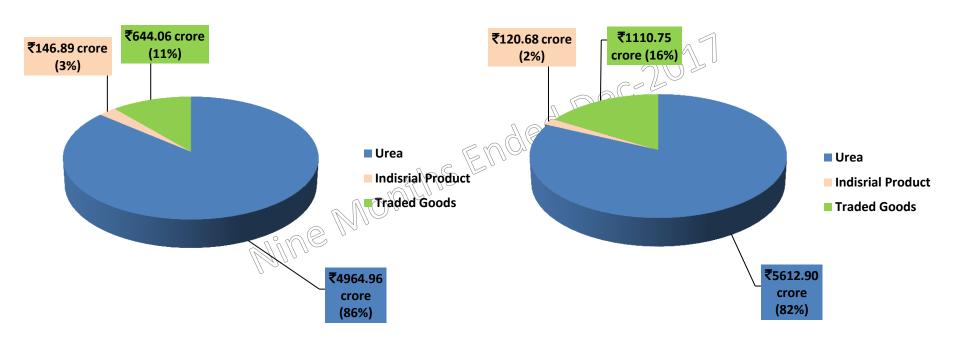




# Sale Value of Urea and Other Products for Nine Months Ended 17

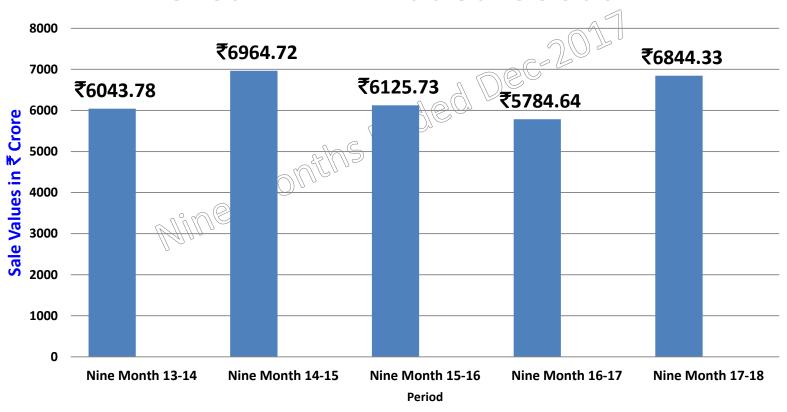

#### STEPS TAKEN TO REDUCE FINANCE COST

- Commercial paper (CP) borrowing increased to 93% (with average cost of 6.28%) as compared to 91% (at average cost of 7.19%) leading to reduced interest cost
- Borrowing through CP for a higher period of 60 to 90 days instead of 30 days which led to reduction in CP overhead cost
- Raised funds through borrowing against Inter Corporate Deposits from PSUs at a very competitive rate of 6.05% p.a.
- Raised short term funds through CD Rate and MIBOR linked loan as per the requirement from banks aggressively at cheaper rate.
- Increase in credit period from 15 days to 30 days for bag procurement (expected savings Rs.1.00 cr.)
- Payment Facilitation agreement in lieu of payment securitization (LC) executed on 2.02.2018 with IOCL which shall lead to savings in LC charges.
- Negotiation with IOCL is at advanced stage for increase in credit period to 15 days against Gas supply payment.
- Signed Agreement with SBI on 29.12.2017 in respect of Dealer Financing Scheme (e-DFS) to make available cheaper loan at interest rate of 8.80% pa to dealers as against their general borrowing rate of around 10% to 14% pa. It will enable NFL to manage its working capital requirement in a better way.
- Signed Agreement with SBI on 29.12.2017 in respect of Vendor Financing Scheme (e-VFS) to enable vendors to get loan at 8% pa from SBI. It will enable NFL to manage its working capital requirement in a better way.

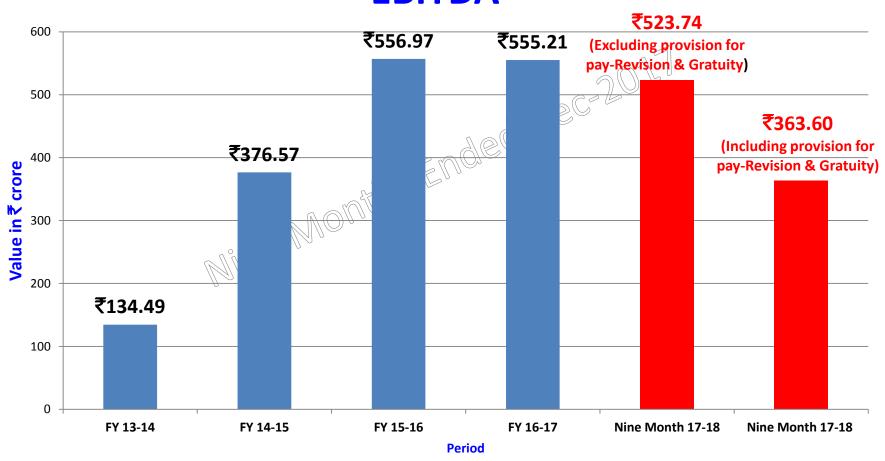

# INVESTMENT IN RAMAGUNDAM FERTILIZERS & CHEMICAL LIMITED (RFCL) PROJECT

#### Detail of the project

- Brownfield project for manufacturing of urea with Annual Installed Capacity of 12.71 LMT.
- Process Licensor for supply of Technology & Know-how for Ammonia is HTAS Denmark and for Urea is SAIPEM Italy.
- Project is being implemented through EPCM mode and M/s EILis EPMC contractor.
- Zero Date 25<sup>th</sup> September 2015.
- Scheduled commissioning date is September 2018.
- Project Capital Cost ₹ 5254 crore (US \$ 809.60 Million)
- Debt Equity of 75 : 25 (Debt of ₹3940 crore and Equity of ₹ 1314 crore).
- Equity contribution NFL 26%, EIL 26%, FCIL 11%, State Government of Telangana 11% already tied up and 26% under tie-up {i.e. GAIL (14.30 %) and consortium of HTAS (11.70 %)}.
- Debt of ₹ 3940 crore has been tied-up with SBI led consortium of six Banks.

#### Current Status

- Gas Supply agreement signed with M/s GAIL on 17.11.2017.
- Gas Transportation agreement signed with M/s GTIL on 8.07.2016.
- Agreement for Water and Power connectivity through Govt. of Telangana is under progress.



#### Cont.... RFCL PROJECT investment

- Debt of ₹ 3940 crore has been arranged from consortium of six banks and disbursement of loan has begun and loan of ₹ 615.92 crore has been drawn as on 31.12.2017.
- ➤ NFL & EIL has contributed equity of ₹ 218.69 crore each till 31.12.2017. Equity contribution by Govt. of Telangana is ₹ 72.21 crore till 31.12.2017.
- ➤ Actual capital expenditure of ₹1103 crore has been incurred till 31.12.2017.

- Energy saving projects at Vijaipur-I & II units in compliance to NUP-2015 with a project cost of ₹ 220 crore and NIT under finalization
- > Natural Draft Prilling Tower at Panipat & Bathinda Units ₹ 90 crore
