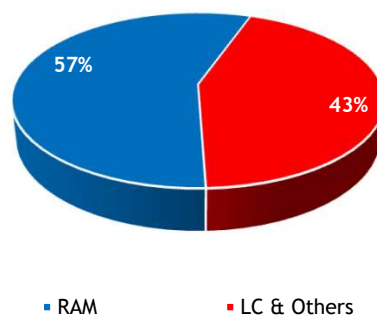

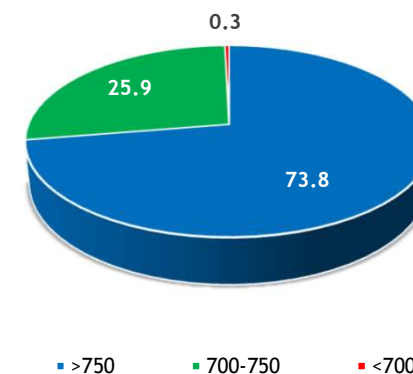

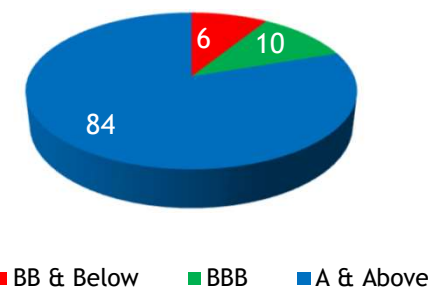

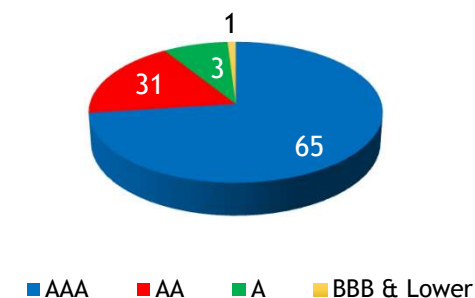

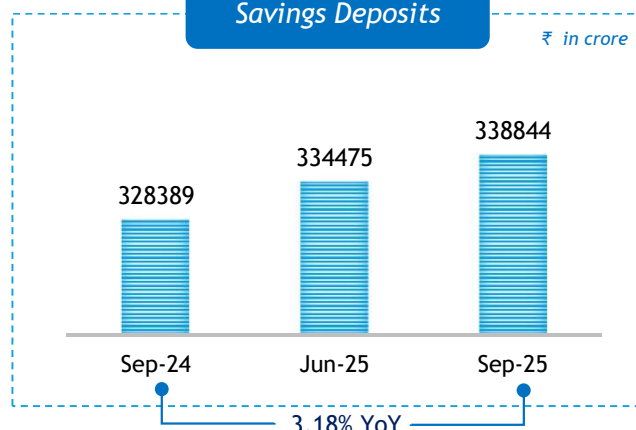
Composition of Deposits (%)

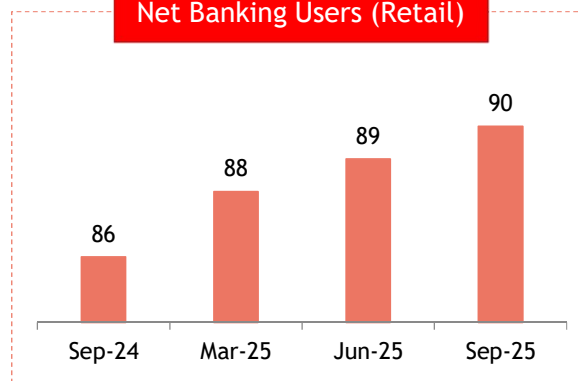

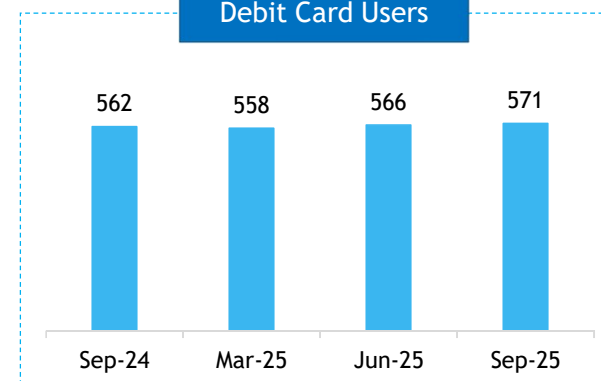

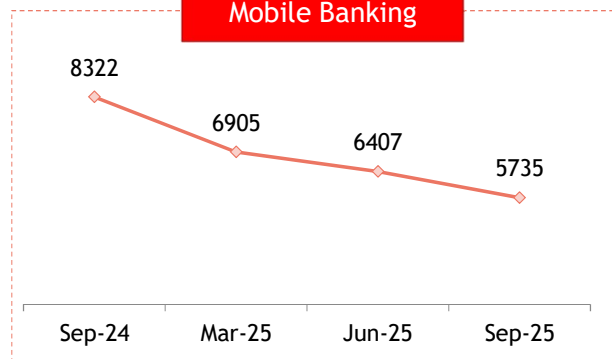

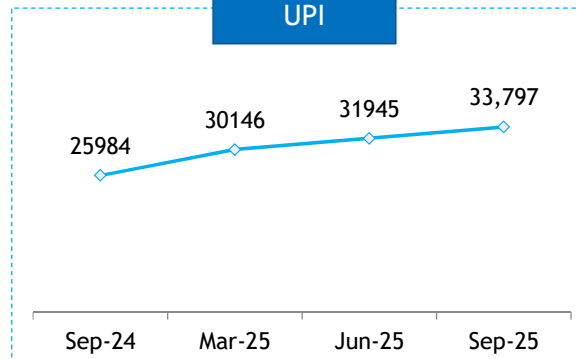
Volume of Transactions (Q-o-Q)

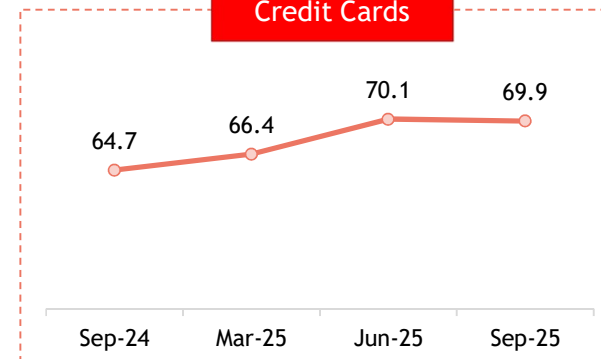
