Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of Standalone Financial Results of S.P. Apparels Limited ("the Company") for the year ended March 31, 2023 ("the Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the statement:

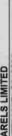

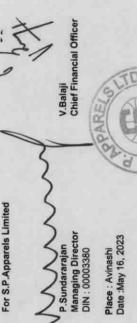
